A **School Parent Compact** for Achievement is an agreement that parents, students, and teachers develop together. It explains how parents and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards.

Effective Compacts:

- Link to goals of the school improvement plan
- Focus on student learning skills
- Describe how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction
- Share strategies parents can use at home
- Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom

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Our Goals for Student Achievement 2020-2021

District Goals:

- By the end of FY21, the percent of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on GA Milestones EOG will increase by 2%.
- By the end of FY21, the "Closing the Gaps" score will increase by 10% (based on FY19 "Closing the Gaps" score) at each level (elementary, middle, and high).
- By the end of FY21, the percentage of Economically Disadvantaged students moving into the "proficient" and "distinguished" levels on EOG will increase by 3.

School Goals:

- **ELA:** 85% of students will be on grade level or demonstrate 1 year or more growth as measured by Fountas and Pinell reading benchmark (gr k-5). The overall weighted proficiency in ELA for Lyman Hall will increase by 5% from 34.7 to 39.7 (gr 3-5)
- **Reading:** 60% of our students will be reading on or above grade level expectations as measured by Fountas and Pinell benchmark assessment (gr k-5) and overall weighted proficiency in reading as indicated by the EOG Lexile reading status (gr 3-5).
- **Math:** The overall weighted proficiency in Mathematics for Lyman Hall will rise from 53% to 58%

Teachers, Parents, and Students - Together for Success!

School/Teacher Responsibilities:

Lyman Hall teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Offer free parent and family workshops in math, literacy, canvas and Launch Point for grades K-5 in the evening via zoom.
- Our monthly newsletter will feature strategies and games that can be used to help improve literacy and math skills.
- Our school webpage and social media pages will have family friendly websites to improve literacy and math skills.
- Teachers will use Remind to communicate with parents and share reminders and notices.

Family Responsibilities:

Lyman Hall parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas to add to this list:

- Try to attend literacy and math evening virtual workshops or get information from my child's teacher if we can't attend.
- Look for the class newsletter each month, check out the school website and implement strategies and games suggested.
- Play words games with the new vocabulary words and use math in everyday family activities and conversation.
- Parents will use Remind to receive reminders and any communication from the teachers.

Student Responsibilities

Lyman Hall students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Talk to my family about new vocabulary words and what I am learning in math.
- Bring home our class newsletter and notices about workshops.
- Use the games and ideas sent home on the newsletter.
- Get on the computer and use the online resources at least three times a week.
