

OUR GOALS FOR STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT 2022-2023

District goals


Goal 1: By the end of FY23, the percentage of students in each subgroup moving into the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments will increase by 2% in the "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance.

Goal 2: Increase the percentage of referred students who access school-based mental health services by 2% each year (with FY21 being the baseline year) to decrease the number of OSS days in grades 6-12.

School goals

Goal 1: Lyman Hall will increase the combined percentage of students in "Proficient" and "Distinguished" levels of performance on the Georgia Milestones Assessments by 2%.

Goal 2: Lyman Hall will increase the percentage of students who have a trusted adult by 5.3% (89.7 to 95%) based on students' SEL surveys.



TEACHERS, PARENTS, AND STUDENTS - TOGETHER FOR SUCCESS!

School/Teacher Responsibilities:

Lyman Hall teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- Offer free parent and family workshops in math, literacy, canvas and Launch Point for grades K-5 in the evening.
- Links, videos, and information with strategies and games that can be used to help improve literacy and math skills will be send via Remind.
- Teachers will use Remind to communicate with parents and share valuable educational resources.
- Post a link to the District Parent Resource Catalog, Big Ideas on the school website that offers tips and resources for parents to support their child with math and reading skills

Student Responsibilities

Lyman Hall students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- Talk to my family about new vocabulary words and what I am learning in math.
- Bring home our class flyers/documents and notices about workshops.
- Use the games and ideas sent home shared via Remind.
- Get on the computer and use the online resources at least three times a week.
- Use the District Parent Resource Catalog website to practice and reinforce the skills needed to master the reading and math standards learned in school

Family Responsibilities:

Lyman Hall parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading and math. Families may have other ideas to add to this list:

- Try to attend literacy and math evening parent workshops or get information from their child's teacher if unable to attend.
- Play words games with the new vocabulary words and use math in everyday family activities and conversation.
- Parents will use Remind to receive valuable information and any communication from the teachers
- Visit the Hall County's Big Ideas website utilizing parent resources (accessible in English and Spanish) that include instructional videos and questions to ask my child in an effort to check reading and math fluency
